

School Rules and Regulations

- 1. Every student will bring his/her school diary daily to the school without fail.
- 2. Students availing their own transport should reach school at least five minutes before the scheduled school time.
- 3. Students are required to report to their respective classrooms as soon as they report to the school.
- 4. A neat and complete school uniform on all school days as well as PTIs and at all school functions is a must. It includes done up hair and trimmed nails.
- 5. School property is for convenient utilization, so students are expected to avoid causing any damage or spoilage to any and every kind of school property. It may lead to imposition of fine and recovery of cost.
- 6. Books, notebooks, assignments, projects, etc. must be carried according to the timetable and diary notes. No books (other than text or library books), magazines or periodicals may be brought to school without the permission of the Head of School.
- 7. Students are not allowed to bring razor blades or sharp-edged instruments to the school.
- 8. The school is not responsible for articles/personal belongings lost by the student. Students are not allowed to bring valuables (mobile phones, gold, precious ornaments, etc.) to the school.
- 9. Parents/Guardians are not permitted to enter the class room to meet their wards or seek unscheduled meetings/interviews with teachers during school hours.
- 10. No student is allowed to leave the class or school premises during school hours without the permission of the Class Teacher and the Head of School.
- 11. After the morning bell, the school gates will be closed and entry for the students will not be permitted unless there is a valid reason.
- 12. Students are expected to be honest, behave with dignity and treat others with respect and courtesy. Behaviour of the individual should not interfere with the rights of others. This includes the use of appropriate language, action and attire. Shouting, bullying or use of foul language is strictly forbidden.
- 13. The students must not write or make undesirable sketches on the wall/furniture tops/doors.

- 14. To inculcate the willingness and likeness for using English language and also to enhance the students' English speaking skills, conversation only in English has been made mandatory for all students.
- 15. The students are expected to develop a sense of belongingness to the institute. Their actions must reflect respect for the faculty members and must inculcate a spirit of fellow-feeling and mutual respect amongst themselves.
- 16. The staff and students of the school are happy to offer their best wishes on a student's birthday. However, since learning time at school is very important, no birthday parties are allowed in school. It is very important that no gifts or expensive chocolates are distributed. Students from class VI onwards are expected to be in proper school uniform even on their birthdays. Parents must ensure that the above mentioned is strictly adhered to.



A Checklist For Parents Remember and Follow

Home is the place where the child learns his/her first lesson and it is here that the foundations are laid to become a good human being. Various aspects of the personality like character building, developing relationship, etc. commence from home. School education indeed promotes these traits and also aids in discovering and nurturing other potentials of the child. In order to secure maximum exposure and progress of the child and evolve him/her as an all-round developed human, a healthy communication, cooperation and coordination between the parents and school is essential.

- Kindly ensure that your ward carries his/her diary daily to the school. You are expected to go through it everyday to keep yourself well informed with the latest development regarding your child's learning.
- 2. Parents need to go through the circulars sent by the school and take prompt action on them.
- 3. Students are expected to appear in all unit tests and examinations as re-test for the same will not be scheduled.
- 4. Leave record pages must be duly filled in.
- 5. Parents must attend the Parent Teacher Interaction regularly as it helps to keep abreast with the standard of child's learning.
- Parents are not permitted to meet their ward or teachers in classrooms. If any parent wants, for whatever reasons, to meet the ward during school hours, he/ she should contact the Head of School in her office.
- 7. Any change in the address or telephone no. must be intimated to the school office promptly.
- 8. Keep a track of your child's performance in class tests, unit tests and examinations and send the answer script duly signed at the earliest.
- To inculcate competency in spoken English, all students must converse in English
 while in school. Parents need to create conducive environment at home to
 improve their ward's conversational skills.
- 10. Parents must check their wards if they pick up foul, abusive and non parliamentary language.
- 11. No expensive gifts are to be sent for distribution on birthdays.

- 12. Send a healthy and complete meal in a properly packed tiffin box to avoid spoiling of books, etc. in the bag.
- 13. In case of any change in address or contact numbers, parents need to inform the school in written at the earliest.
- 14. Parents should provide a supportive, value-based environment to their child's physical, mental and emotional well-being.

Teaching Methodology

"Learning is a treasure that will follow its owner everywhere."

The teaching methodology: CBIL and VBIL, i.e. Concept Based Integrated Learning and Value Based Integrated Learning facilitates the integration of global ideas and the rich cultural beliefs and values of India. The curriculum is in accordance with the guidelines of the CBSE and is followed through NCERT text books. Sports and physical education have an important place in the curriculum and are compulsory for all the students. Performing and creative arts are as much a part of the student's school life as is academics.

Academic Approach:

I. Interactive Approach

The curriculum is integrated so that learning happens primarily through projects, learning centers and playful activities. Skills required to carry out projects are learnt and interests of children are reflected in the work. Interdisciplinary teaching integrates Mathematics, Science, Social Science and Communication Applications.

II. Differentiated Instruction Strategy

A proactive, flexible and student centered approach is the key to provide instruction that maximizes opportunities for all students to learn. With differentiated instruction, the teacher aims to create learning situations that match students' current abilities and preferred learning styles while stretching their abilities and encouraging them to try new ways of learning. Different types of activities with varying degrees of complexity are provided in order to focus on different learning styles and developmental levels. The quick learners are stimulated by follow up exercises and challenging assignments. Children with different learning abilities are given individual attention, simple instructions and exposure to different learning aids to which they can respond.

III. Multiple Intelligence Approach

The multiple intelligence classroom acts like the 'real' world. Students become more active, involved learners. When we 'teach for understanding', our students accumulate positive educational experiences and the capability for creating solutions to problems in life. Students become balanced individuals who can function as members of their culture. Classroom activities that cater to the intelligences foster deep understanding about the essential questions of life, such as: Where do we come from? What's the world made of? What have humans achieved? What can we achieve? How does one lead a good life?

IV. Home Work Policy

Homework is seen as a valuable resource for teaching, allowing students to practice, and in doing so, learn the unit material. It establishes the habit of working hard and that too regularly. We know that good assignments, completed successfully, can help children develop wholesome habits and attitudes. Homework can help parents learn about their children's education and communicate both with their children and the school, and it can encourage a lifelong love for learning.

V. School Script

Marion Richardson Script

Marion Richardson was a London School inspector who recommended joining most but not all letters. The letters are less complex than the print/script forms; they do not have the loops and curls of looped cursive.

VI. Assessment

Assessment is an integral part of the educational process. In conformity with the new evaluation scheme suggested by the CBSE and National Education Policy (NEP) guidelines, the assessment of the students is continuous and comprehensive. Equal emphasis is given to co-curricular activities along with academics.

VII. EVALUATION IN PRIMARY CLASSES (Pre School-II)

This evaluation scheme takes care of the assessment of the all-round development of the child's personality. To evaluate the scholastic areas:

- (a) Three cycles of weekly tests are conducted for classes I and II.
- (b) The absolute marks are translated into grades in the academic assessment.

VIII. EVALUATION IN CLASSES III-VIII

The academic year is divided into TWO TERMS—Term I (September/October) and Term II (February/March). The assessment will be done in Scholastic and Coscholastic aspects. Scholastic aspects will be subject specific areas whereas coscholastic aspects will include co-scholastic activities for the holistic development of the student.

Each Term will have one cycle of Periodic Tests, Subject Enrichment activities, Project-based activities, Portfolio, Multiple Assessments and Term End Examination. Marks will also be awarded for attendance.

IX. ASSESSMENT STRUCTURE FOR CLASSES IX AND XI

The academic session is divided into two terms—Term I and Term II. The assessment will be done in scholastic and co-scholastic aspects. Periodic Tests, Multiple Assessment, Portfolio, Subject Enrichment activities (IX), and Project and Internal Assessment (XI) will be conducted throughout the session.

X. ASSESSMENT STRUCTURE FOR CLASSES X AND XII

Term I and two sets of Pre-Board examinations are conducted for classes X and XII. Unit Tests, Mock Tests will be administered throughout the session to give the students practice in taking final examinations of the prescribed syllabus and per the CBSE Guidelines. Practical examinations/Project/Internal Assessments are held all year round in accordance with the CBSE.

XI. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

No student is generally eligible to appear in the Annual Examination who has not put in at least 75% of the actual attendance during the session as per the school calendar.

Ensuring Personality Development

Thematic Assemblies

Morning assemblies form an integral part of the curriculum and are observed on themes which are planned at the beginning of the session. Values, festivals and days of national and international importance are celebrated through these assemblies, ensuring the development of intrapersonal, interpersonal and social skills.

House System

In an endeavour towards grooming of students to inculcate the qualities of confidence, team spirit and healthy competitiveness, the entire school community from class III onwards is divided into four houses

- Nalanda
- Pisa
- Takshila
- Alexandria

Camps, Excursions and Trips

Adventure Camps, excursions and educational trips are a valuable aspect of a fully rounded programme of development for students which aid in increasing knowledge and appreciation. They are an effective means of motivating students and engaging them in active learning experiences.

Green Initiatives

SRWS strongly believes in nurturing the environment and preserving it for future generations. The students are sensitized to this pressing need of the hour through projects, street plays and tours which are also community outreach programmes.

Social Initiatives

Each individual has a responsibility towards his/her family, society, nation and the environment. To inculcate and enhance these qualities, not only students, but also their families are motivated towards community service. Initiatives such as numerous donations, Environment Awareness Campaigns and presentations propose to expose our students to a reality outside their own experience so that they may learn to cope with unexpected difficulties and mature in the process.

Seminars, Symposia and Workshops

A variety of skills, values as well as important information is disseminated to the students through comprehensive programmes of talks, seminars and workshops. The students are sent out to attend the same at out of school locations as well. A rigorous calendar of in-service training for the teachers ensures their skill building and keeps them abreast with the latest trends in education and pedagogy.

Communication With Parents

1. School Website

The school website (www.ShreeRam.in) is an important and an effective medium to get the latest updates about the school activities along with photographs and videos.

2. Almanac

The almanac is a means for the parents to communicate effectively with the school. Parents may use the ruled pages whenever they wish to communicate with the teacher. They must go through their child's almanac every day. Circulars from school are also sent in the almanac. They must countersign all communication after reading them.

3. SMS

SMSs are sent regularly by the school to the mobile number of parents. In case SMSs are not being received, parents must check with the school office. They must also ensure that the latest mobile numbers are updated in the school records.

4. Parent Teacher Interaction

The school schedules each third and fourth Saturday of the working month as a Parent-Teacher Meeting. It provides an opportunity for parents to meet the class teacher and subject teachers of their ward on a one-to-one basis. It is also an occasion to interact with the Head of School.

Child Protection Procedure

Ensuring safety and security of our students is our topmost priority. The following systems have been devised for the same.

Identity Cards

The students of SRWS are issued a set of two Identity Cards-one for the student and one for the parent. The student must wear the student I-card every day to school. A student will be handed over to the Parent/Guardian/Van Driver only if the Parent's I-card is carried by them.

Visitor's Badges

All visitors must sign in at the gate and then report to the reception. At the gate, they must collect a visitor's badge which must be worn by them in the school campus. The visitor's badge must be returned to the guards at the school gate when the visitor exits.

Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) Cameras

CCTV surveillance systems in the school and in the buses are a way of ensuring a safe, secure and healthy learning environment for children. CCTV cameras are of great help to monitor the movement of people visiting the school. The entire school building is under the surveillance of CCTV cameras.

Provision of First and Fast Aid

Although the school takes all measures and precautions to ensure the physical safety of the students, a well-equipped medical centre and a trained nurse is available to ensure first and fast relief in case of any emergency. Depending on the crisis, the student may be taken to the nearest multi-speciality hospital for appropriate medical attention. Parents must fill the medical information form provided in the almanac at the beginning of every session to facilitate timely action.

Emergency Procedures

In the event of any emergency, a continuous alarm is sounded. Teachers along with their classes vacate the classrooms as per evacuation routes already planned and put up on the School Notice Boards. Regular Mock Evacuation Drills are conducted to keep the students aware of the systems.

GPS Access

At SRWS, we have GPS vehicle tracking systems installed in all the school buses. Such a system helps in ensuring the safety, better management, control and monitoring along with the other necessary checks. The school and the parents can monitor the location of the school buses by simply sending an SMS.

School Bus Management System

RFID school bus tracking system generates a message to the parents' phone through the School Buddy App informing them that their child has boarded the bus/reached the school. It is a unique comprehensive system for managing the daily school bus operation that links the school, the parents and the buses into one powerful system.

- 1. The school accepts fees on monthly basis. The parents who desire to make payment on quarterly, six monthly or yearly basis, may do so as per their convenience. The school fee is to be paid regularly by the 10th of the month in which it becomes due. If the 10th of the month in which the school dues are to be paid happens to be a holiday, then the payment is to be made on the date following the 10th day. In case the fee is not deposited by the due date, the fee will be collected with late fee @ Rs. 20/- per day from the 11th of the month, till the end of the month. If the school fee is not paid by the end of the month, the name of the child will be struck off from the school roll and re-admission will be at the discretion of the Head of School and on the payment of the re-admission fee.
- 2. The school fee can be paid either through online mode or by cheque (duly filled as per the instructions given on the fee requisition slip).
- 3. Fee cheques may be dropped in the drop box by parents/students (1st to 10th of every month) (24x7).
- 4. Cheque dishonour charges @ Rs 300/- per cheque with late fee (if any) will be accepted only in cash.

Attendance and Withdrawal Rules

- 1. Students need to follow the virtue of being regular and punctual to the school.
- 2. In case of absenteeism, the student must bring duly filled leave record (provided in the almanac).
- 3. Withdrawal of child during school hours for attending religious/social function is not allowed. In case of emergency, the Head of School may be contacted.
- 4. No leave of absence is granted except for compelling/unavoidable reasons subject to a written application submitted well in advance.
- 5. All students are expected to attend the school on the opening day after vacation. Absence of student for more than five days without intimation after vacation renders the student liable to have his/her name struck off from the rolls.
- 6. If a student absents himself/herself from the school without leave for more than ten consecutive days, his/her name is liable to be struck off from the rolls. Re-admission may be allowed on payment of fresh admission fee.
- 7. A student, returning to school after suffering an infectious or contagious disease, should produce a doctor's fitness certificate permitting him/her to attend school. Students suffering from the following diseases must observe the prescribed period of quarantine before returning to school.

CHICKEN POX Till the scabs fall completely (Not > 15 Days)

CHOLERA Till the child has completely recovered (Not > 15 Days)

MEASLES Two weeks after the rash disappears (Not > 10 Days)

MUMPS
Until the swelling has gone (Not > 20 days)
WHOOPING COUGH
Till the doctor certifies (Not > 20 Days)
HEPATITIS
Till the doctor certifies (Not > 20 Days)

- 8. In case of withdrawal of a child, written information should be sent to the Head of School one calendar month in advance or else one month's fee will be charged.
- 9. Transfer Certificate will be issued only once all dues of the school are settled.
- 10. As per the CBSE norms minimum 75% of attendance is required to be eligible for promotion to the next grade.

School Uniform

School uniform brings about the feeling of oneness amongst the students and a sense of responsibility in their attitude. Wearing the school uniform should be a matter of pride for the students. Uniform gives them identification, instills discipline and maintains the school identity and spirit. All children are expected to consistently wear the correct uniform to school on all working days. The uniform can be procured from the school on all working days between 8:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.

- Students are expected to wear the correct school uniform and keep their appearance neat and tidy. They are not to wear items that deviate from the uniform listed in the almanac.
- 2. All items of clothing must be clearly marked with the child's full name.
- 3. Shoes can be marked on the inside with a waterproof marker.
- 4. Identity cards must be worn at all times.
- 5. Nails must be kept short and clean.
 - Girls must wear only one small stud or small earrings.
 - Girls who have very short hair are allowed to wear their hair loose, but pinned up.
 - Ribbons and bands should be of black colour.

Girls Are Not Permitted To

- 1. Have streaked hair, fancy hairstyles, leave shoulder length or long hair untied.
- 2. Get layered haircut which makes them look unkempt.
- 3. Wear eye makeup or any other kind of makeup during school hours.
- 4. Wear gold earrings, bangles, chains, colourful and fancy jewellery.
- 5. Adorn their hair with colourful clips.
- 6. Apply nail paint or henna.
- 7. Have body tattoos.

Boys Are Not Permitted To

- 1. Wear any kind of headgear to school.
- 2. Have streaked hair, long hair, long side burns or fancy hairstyles.
- 3. Wear bracelets/ chains/ friendship bands or other bands.
- 4. Pierce ears or wear ear studs.
- Apply any kind of hair gel or mousse.
- Have body tattoos.

Uniform is checked on a regular basis, uniform defaulter record is maintained and parents are informed about it. In case of repeated defaulters, strict disciplinary action may be taken.



School Transport

GPS enabled air-conditioned School Transport is available to take pupils to and from the school. Those using buses will be picked up and dropped only at the stops pre-fixed by the school. No child shall be picked up from his/her door step. It is the responsibility of the parents/guardians to bring and pick up their wards to and from the school bus stops. In case the pupil wants to discontinue the use of school transport, the parent will have to give one month's notice or one month's charges in lieu thereof.

- Parents are requested to pick and drop the child at the school bus stop on time as the buses will not wait in any case.
- Temporary shift or change of the bus route/stop in any case shall not be accepted.
 In such cases, parents are requested to make their own arrangements.
- With change of address, if the bus route of the student needs to be changed then it would be done only if the said route has a vacancy or if the route already exists. No mid term route changes or extensions will be done.
- All students using the school bus are expected to be at the bus stop, at least five minutes before the arrival time of the bus.
- The routes of the buses are preplanned and parents should consult the Transport Incharge for necessary details. The drivers are authorized to stop buses at the designated stop only.
- All students must occupy seats immediately after boarding their buses. Students
 must not move around inside the bus and no part of their body should be outside
 the bus.
- A teacher-in-charge is there in each bus with the children. Any problems in the bus are brought to the notice of the Teacher Incharge and the Head of the School immediately.
- Parents are requested not to board the school bus.
- It is also requested that any issue/problem related to school transport may be
 discussed with the school authorities/Transport Incharge in the school only. Under
 no circumstances will children be allowed to board another bus to fulfill social
 engagements or otherwise.
